Former Secretary General of International Peace Research Association Professor in Peace Research and Sociology, Vice-President, Mie University

Katsuya Kodama was born in Hiroshima in 1959, as the son of the survivor of Hiroshima. He received his Master's degree in international relations from Hiroshima University in 1984. His research theme for his Master's degree is on the life history of 'Atomic Orphans' who lost their parents by atomic bombing in Hiroshima.

In his youth, he had been actively involved in the non-violent peace movement in Hiroshima as a leader of the peace organization of the youth. He sat down in the Peace Memorial Park in Hiroshima to protest to the nuclear tests whenever the nuclear tests were reported. His non-violent peace activities led to the further study on the non-violent peace movements.

He studied on non-violent peace movements at Lund university, Sweden, from 1984 to 1990. He received his PhD in Sociology from Lund university.

He became Assistant Professor of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at Mie University in 1990. He was promoted to Associate Professor in 1992 and further promoted to Professor in 2004. He has been Vice-President of Mie University since 2011. His research theme widely includes; non-violent peace activism, study on Survivors of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, refugee issues, foreign workers, peace-building..

He specializes in peace studies and comparative sociology. He is an internationally recognized figure and active in many international organizations.

From 2000 to 2004 he served as Secretary General of the International Peace Research Association, an organization seeking to advance interdisciplinary research into the conditions of peace and the causes of war and other forms of violence. The International Peace Research Association is the only world-wide academic association of peace researchers and it has been awarded the UNESCO Peace Education Prize in 1989. He has become once again the Secretary General of the International Peace Research Association together with Jake Lynch at Sydney University since July, 2010. He had served as Secretary General of the Asia-Pacific Peace Research Association (APPRA) from 1996 to 2000, an international collaboration that, among other objectives, facilitates contacts between peace researchers, educators and advocates as well as specialists in conflict resolution throughout the Asia-Pacific region.

He had served as Vice-President of International Social Science Council (ISSC) at UNESCO from 2006 to 2010. He is at present an Executive Committee member of ISSC.

He has been proposing the "Hiroshima-Nagasaki Process" to abolish nuclear weapons by the

power of world citizens. The proposal has been repeatedly advocated and now is becoming a world-wide movement. He is an activist and advocator of non-violent movement for world peace.

He has also worked for the empowerment of local initiatives. He is actively working for empowerment of local people and organizations in the Mie Prefecture through the works of Mie University Local Area Studies Center as Vice-President of Mie university. He is approaching global peace through local initiatives and empowerment of local actors.

He is now creating a new type of media called UBrainTV. With UBrainTV, new networks of academics, big business, international organizations, civil organizations, banks, etc. are being created.
